Add some French flair to your Pâques petit déjeuner

Blue Boheme brings back some of its most popular brunch items for a three-course, prix fixe menu that mixes traditional breakfast items with heartier fare. First course choices include bisque de homard (lobster bisque) and tarte chaude au Reblochon (Reblochon Savoie cheese, onion, bacon and apple tart) while second courses feature a savory Belgique prosciutto waffle, boeuf Bourguignon, or confit de canard (duck confit). Desserts lean towards the traditional with mousse au chocolat, pain d'epices (warm gingerbread cake with strawberry confiture and caramel ice cream), Nutella crepes, and profiteroles. A separate children's menu ensures that everyone leaves happy.
